IN LOUISIANA IS A WILL NECESSARY WHEN OUR ESTATE IS SMALL AND WE HAVE MINOR CHILDREN?

Regardless of wealth, parents with minor children have estate planning concerns that are unique and require special planning.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DIE WITHOUT A WILL AND I HAVE CHILDREN?

Louisiana law of intestacy will control. Assuming that you are married at your death and all the property that you and your spouse own is community property, then when one spouse dies his/her interest is left to his/her children, and the surviving spouse becomes a co-owner with the children, with a limited right of use. Court intervention may be required to sell the property and proceeds may be restricted if the children are minors. Drafting a Last Will and Testament can avoid this effect.

HOW DO I NAME SOMEONE TO TAKE CARE OF MY CHILDREN?

In your Last Will and Testament, you may nominate a guardian/tutor to take care of the person and property of your minor children. Without making the proper nomination, a judge appoints the guardian/tutor.
